

FEATHERED FARM BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES & DISCIPLINE

Bullying Policy

At The Feathered Farm, LLC, bullying is inexcusable, and we have a firm policy against all types of bullying. Each camper is expected to treat all other campers and animals with respect, and to help each other achieve the best possible experience. If a camper has difficulty meeting this expectation, parents may be called upon to assist.

Behavior Guidelines

Please read our behavior policy with your camper before camp.

We expect campers to act respectfully at all times when they are on our property and participating in our programs. Campers are to behave in a mature, responsible way and to respect the right and dignity of others.

Campers will be expected to:

- Take Responsibility for their actions
- Respect themselves, each other, camp equipment, the animals and the environment
- Honesty will be the basis for all relationships and interactions
- Be Caring in their relationships with others and the animals

Campers should talk to a farm employee if they are uncomfortable with an experience or need assistance while at camp.

Discipline Procedures

While we hope these procedures are never needed, we feel it is best to lay out a plan of action if a camper does not follow the behavior guidelines. The following action steps will be taken.

1. Staff will redirect the camper to more appropriate behavior.
2. If inappropriate behavior continues, the camper will be reminded of the guidelines and camp rules, and the camper will be asked to decide on action steps to correct his/her behavior.
3. If a child's behavior still does not meet expectations and is affecting the experience of other campers, he/she will be referred to a Senior farm employee.
4. If inappropriate behavior continues, as a final action step the camper may be dismissed from camp.

Examples of unacceptable behavior:

- Refusing to follow behavior guidelines or camp rules
- Using profanity, vulgarity or obscenity
- Stealing or damaging property (personal or camp property)
- Refusal to participate in activities or cooperate with staff
- Disrupting a program
- Leaving a program without permission
- Endangering the health and safety of children and/or staff
- Teasing, make fun or bullying of other campers or staff
- Fighting of any kind
- Chasing the animals or chickens

Camper fees are non-refundable if a camper is sent home for disciplinary reasons. Physical violence or bullying towards another camper or staff member will result in immediate dismissal from the camp program.

Only electronic devices needed for communication will be allowed at the camp. All other devices must remain in book bags.
